### REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

To the board of trustees of

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Carte Blanche: "Making a difference" Trust, which comprise the report of the trustees, the statement of financial position as at February 28, 2014, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income and the cash flow statement of the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

### Trustees responsibility for the financial statements

The trustees are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the annual financial statements in accordance with the International financial reporting standards. This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of annual financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

The trustees have the pleasure in submitting their report for the financial year ended 28 February 2014.

### STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and the preparation and integrity of the financial statements and related information. The accounting officers are responsible to determine that the financial statements are in agreement with the accounting records.

The trustees are also responsible for the trusts system of internal financial control. These are designated to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the reliability of the financial statements, and to adequately safeguard, verify and maintain accountability of assets, and to prevent and detect misstatement and loss. Nothing has come to the attention of the trustees to indicate that any material breakdown in the functioning of these controls, procedures and systems has occurred during the year under review. The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, since the trustees have every reason to believe that the trust has adequate resources in place to continue operation for the foreseeable future.

### NATURE OF THE TRUSTS ACTIVITIES

The trust derives its funds from donations and utilises these funds to provide means for public training hospitals and distributions to charities namely the Johannesburg Child Welfare, the Johannesburg Parent and Child Counselling Centre, the Hartebees Poort Child and Counselling Centre and Thousand Hill Community Centre

### RESULTS FOR THE YEAR

Full details are set out in the financial statements attached hereto and the trustees have no further comment.

### GOING CONCERN

The Trustees believe that the Trust, has adequate financial resources to continue in operation for the foreseeable future and accordingly the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Trustees are satisfied that the Trust is in a sound financial position and that it has access to sufficient borrowing facilities to meet its foreseeable cash requirements. The Trustees are not aware of any new material changes that may adversely impact the Trust. The Trustees are also not aware of any material non-compliance with statutory or regulatory requirements or of any pending changes to legislation which may affect the Trust.

The Trustees are not aware of any facts or circumstances which have occurred since the end of the Trust's financial year and the date of this report, which might influence an assessment of the state of affairs of the Trust.

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following are the principal accounting policies of the trust which are consistent in all material respects.

### 1.1 Basis of presentation

The financial statements of the trust are presented on the historic cost basis and are consistent with previous years.

### 1.2 Revenue

Cash collections from donations, rent received and sundry income are brought to account on a cash received basis. Donations contractually committed before the year-end are accrued where receipts of the funds are assured

Interest is recognised on a time proportion basis, taking into account the principal outstanding and the effective rate over the period of maturity.

### 1.3 Cash flows

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash includes cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks and investments in money market instruments.
