REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

To the board of trustees of

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Carte Blanche: "Making a difference" Trust, which comprise the report of the trustees, the statement of financial position as at 28 February 2017, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income and the cash flow statement of the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

Trustees responsibility for the financial statements

STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and the preparation and integrity of the financial statements and related information. The accounting officers are responsible to determine that the financial statements are in agreement with the accounting records. The trustees are also responsible for the trusts system of internal financial control. The Trustees are not aware of any facts or circumstances which have occurred since the end of the Trust's financial year and the date of this report, which might influence an assessment of the state of affairs of the Trust.

1.1 Basis of presentation

The financial statements of the trust are presented on the historic cost basis and are consistent with previous years.

1.2 Revenue

Cash collections from donations, rent received and sundry income are brought to account on a cash received basis. Donations contractually committed before the year-end are accrued where receipts of the funds are assured

Interest is recognised on a time proportion basis, taking into account the principal outstanding and the effective rate over the period of maturity.

1.3 Cash flows

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash includes cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks and investments in money market instruments.
