REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

To the board of trustees of

CARTE BLANCHE: "MAKING A DIFFERENCE" TRUST : IT 3593/2008

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Carte Blanche: "Making a difference" Trust, which comprise the report of the trustees, the statement of financial position as at 28 February 2018, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income and the cash flow statement of the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the company in accordance with the Independent Regulatory Board for Auditors Code of Professional Conduct for Registered Auditors (IRBA Code), together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in South Africa. We have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IRBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Trustees responsibility for the financial statements

The trustees are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the annual financial statements in accordance with the International financial reporting standards. This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of annual financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are responsible for assessing the company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the trustees either intend to liquidate the company or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

Auditor's responsibility

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs, we exercised professional judgement and maintained professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identified and assessed the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtained an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the company's internal control.

- Concluded on the appropriateness of the trustees' use of the going concern basis of accounting and based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue as a going concern. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluated the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicated with the trustees regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

Audit opinion

In our opinion, the annual financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the trust as of 28 February 2018, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the International financial reporting standards.

Other Reports

As part of our audit of the financial statements for the year ended 28 February 2018, we have read the Report of the Trustees for the purpose of identifying whether there are material inconsistencies between these reports and the audited financial statements. It is the responsibility of the respective trustees to prepare the Trustees report. Based reading the report, we have not identified material inconsistencies between the Report of the Trustees and the audited financial statements. However, we have not audited the Trustees report and accordingly do not express an opinion on the report.

1.2 Revenue

Cash collections from donations, rent received and sundry income are brought to account on a cash received basis. Donations contractually committed before the year-end are accrued where receipts of the funds are assured

Interest is recognised on a time proportion basis, taking into account the principal outstanding and the effective rate over the period of maturity.

1.3 Cash flows

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash includes cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks and investments in money market instruments.
