REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

To the board of trustees of

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Carte Blanche: "Making a difference" Trust, which comprise the report of the trustees, the statement of financial position as at 29 February 2020, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income and the cash flow statement of the year then ended , and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

Interest is recognised on a time proportion basis, taking into account the principal outstanding and the effective rate over the period of maturity.

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash includes cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks and investments in money market instruments.
